## Declare Your Candidacy – RUN FOR THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The primary responsibilities of the Board are to adopt the annual budget, monitor the financial workings of the Association, and establish policy. The Board also adopts rules, oversees the operation of the Association, and responds to the community's needs and concerns.

## It's Our Budget AUDIT TIME

With 2009 ended and 2010 begun, it is once again time for the Association to close out the 2009 books and prepare for the annual audit. The Board of Directors, at their meeting in October, approved the final engagement letter (which included a timetable and no extension provision) with the Certified Public Accountant firm of Schonwit & Company, to conduct the 2009 audit and preparation of our annual tax returns for a second year.

Upon the complete review of all the Association's financial records, Schonwit & Company will issue a draft audit report and audit adjustment summary; this is due in mid-February, as required by the engagement agreement with the firm. The Association's Budget & Finance Committee will then review the draft report and adjustments, and make a recommendation to the Board of Directors for their approval. On the day after the Board has approved it, the full audit report will be available at the Front Desk of the Club for pick-up by homeowners who request a copy. It will also be posted at [www.lf2.org](http://www.lf2.org) in the Resource Center, in the Financials file. In addition, a summary audit report will be published in the April *Mainsheet*.

## Membership Cards Required

Membership ID cards are required for all residents age 7 or older who wish to use the Sun & Sail Club facilities.

Membership ID cards must be updated, with new ID photos taken, at age 14, and again at age 21.

If you have lost your ID card, you can have it replaced for a fee of \$20.

The City of Lake Forest's Eucalyptus Moratorium begins on April 1. As of that date, you may not trim, cut or remove any eucalyptus trees until November 1, 2010. Don't forget that you must apply for Master Architectural Committee (MAC) approval from the Association if you plan to remove any variety of tree that is 6 feet or more in height. ## TIPS FROM THE CC&R INSPECTORS

Do not place “Children at Play” or other signs, cones or barriers in the street at any time! This becomes a serious hazard by giving parents and children a false sense of security and encouraging small children to enter the street. In addition, such devices can impede normal traffic flow, which can contribute to an accident.

**Reminder**—Parking is not allowed on private streets near El Toro High School during school hours. Parked cars on those streets will be cited and could be towed after two citations. (If you live on one of these streets, and you or your guest receives a parking citation from the Association in error, please give us a call and we’ll rectify the situation.)

## TIPS FROM THE M.A.C.

Many trees in our community have grown very large and are becoming dangerous and may be causing damage to property. Approval from the Master Architectural Committee (M.A.C.) is required prior to removing any tree taller than six (6) feet. Once the tree is removed, the stump and debris must be removed immediately. This applies to ALL TREES, not just eucalyptus trees.

If the tree was removed from an area that was previously landscaped, then the area needs to be returned within a reasonable time to a condition harmonious with the surrounding landscaping. You may plant a new tree, or plant grass, flowers, ground cover, etc.

If you need to remove a eucalyptus tree that has become a hazard, you may do so with M.A.C. approval during the month of March. Between April 1 and October 31 of each year, however, the City’s Eucalyptus Moratorium is in effect; emergency cutting or removal of a eucalyptus tree during those months requires prior M.A.C. approval, and adherence to the following procedures:

1. After any cutting or removal of all or any part of the eucalyptus tree, the eucalyptus wood shall be chipped, buried, and tarped; or removed immediately. Tree stumps must be ground and debris removed immediately.
2. Any stored eucalyptus wood must be tightly covered with an ultra-violet, light-resistant clear plastic tarp at least six (6) mils thick, with the ends of the tarp either weighted or covered with dirt to control tree scent dispersal, and prevent the introduction or exiting of any Eucalyptus Longhorn Borer Beetle, for a minimum of six (6) months before any eucalyptus wood may be used, or the tarp removed.

## Master Board of Directors Meeting – February 3, 2010

VICKI LLOYD APPOINTED TO FILL SEAT VACATED BY LISA SCHOENEGER



*The following is an informal account of the proceedings, not the official Board Meeting Minutes.*

The Master Association's regular Board of Directors meeting was held on Wednesday, February 3, 2010. Board members present were President Steve Valderrama, Vice President Ted Brackez, Treasurer Tom Ludden, and Directors Paul Coulter, Jolene Fuentes, and Jim Richert. [Director Lisa Schoeneberger resigned from the Board of Directors in January.]

Staff members present were General Manager Jo Ann Burrows, Assistant General Manager Cindy Christenson, Community Services Manager Jenny Chambers, Maintenance Manager Dana Baker, Recreation Manager Alisa Millers, and Communications Coordinator Kathy Morrison.

### LIAISON REPORTS

Director Coulter reported that the Master Architectural Committee (MAC) had reviewed 46 exterior-home and yard improvement applications from homeowners in January; the applications comprised 60 projects. Of these, the MAC approved 47 projects as submitted, and 13 with conditions. The predominant projects were new garage doors and new windows... Vice President Brackez stated that there were 158 CC&R violations cited, but that 119 (about 75%) of those were cleared before the Hearing Board met in January. Only the 39 remaining cases had to be addressed by the Hearing Board... Director Fuentes reported that the Lake Forest Keys is working to find the best "boil" for the lake's aeration system... Treasurer Ludden reported on the February 1<sup>st</sup> Budget & Finance Committee meeting, noting that Schonwit & Company would be submitting a draft Audit Report in about two weeks with a 2009 year-end variance of about \$103,000.00; after adjustments, the surplus amount was expected to be around \$100,000.00. Treasurer Ludden complimented the Staff for their money management efforts, resulting in operations at 94.2% of budget. He also noted that the delinquency rate for dues and other fines and assessments was about 6.8%, down from last year's rate of nearly 9%; and that there was an increase in foreclosures over last year... There was no report from Director Richert, the Board's liaison to *The Mainsheet*.

### GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

General Manager Burrows announced that the time was approaching for the

Ms. Burrows advised that anyone interested in running for one of the seven open seats and wishing to have his or her name pre-printed on the ballot, must submit a Statement of Candidacy no later than March 10, 2010. Questions may be addressed to General Manager Burrows by calling her office or sending her an email.

General Manager Burrows reported that the Clubhouse and Youth Center buildings were successfully treated for termites on the previous weekend. The Club was closed Friday, January 29, through Sunday, January 31, because the facilities were being tented for fumigation. The buildings were fully certified early Monday morning, and the Sun & Sail Cub opened on time at 8:00 a.m., although there was a delay in having the gas turned back on.

The first of the Association's quarterly mini-surveys, addressing recreation needs, is in the February Mainsheet and online at [www.lf2.org](http://www.lf2.org) and [www.lf2recreation.org](http://www.lf2recreation.org). Ms. Burrows explained that this is a part of the Association's 2010 Goals in the area of improving communication with the membership, and she encouraged members to complete the very brief survey to let us know the types of events that are of interest to you.

General Manager Burrows commended the Tract Reps of Parkwood Estates II and Boy Scout Troop 629 for participating in a very worthy cause, a shoe drive for the people of Haiti. They collected several hundred pairs of gently worn shoes for men, women and children, in cooperation with the efforts of Sport Chalet. The neighborhood shoe drive was organized by Tract Rep Nita Chu and Tract Rep Chair Martina Zolner.

In addition to their regularly scheduled routine responsibilities during January, the Maintenance Staff removed graffiti in Serrano Ridge and Ranchwood, removed the holiday lights in all neighborhoods, added soil amendments in Forest Creek, repaired the bridge and stairs at Fall Creek Circle in The Woods that were damaged as a result of recent heavy rains, inspected and sorted the pool furniture in preparation for repair and

maintenance of these items, and installed replacement ceiling tiles in hallways on the lower level of the Clubhouse.

General Manager Burrows announced upcoming events including the annual Super Bowl Bash and the Valentine's Eve Comedy Night. Details about these and other events are in *The Mainsheet* at the Recreation website, [www.lf2recreation.org](http://www.lf2recreation.org).

### CONSENT CALENDAR

The Board approved the Consent Calendar, a slate of routine items that included the Action Items Status Report, the Reserve Projects Status Report, the Minutes of the January 6, 2010, Board of Directors Meeting, the Master Association Financials for December, 2009, acceptance of the Lake Forest Keys Financials for December, 2009, and the Investment Supplement Report as of December, 2009.

### APPROVAL OF LIENS

The Board approved the filing of liens against seven properties if their delinquent accounts are not paid by February 28, 2010. This action was in accordance with provisions of the California *Civil Code*.

### POOL FURNITURE

The Board approved the repair of 14 chairs, five loungers and one barstool, and the purchase of three new 42-inch acrylic tabletops and five new chairs. The repair work and the new items will be provided by Seabreeze Patio Furniture at a total cost of \$2,920.00, to be paid from allocated Reserve funds.

### 2010 BOARD ELECTION

In preparation for the 2010 Board Election, the Board of Directors approved the Election Process recommended by the General Manager and the designation of Susan Janowicz of the East Lake Village Community Association in Yorba Linda as the 2010 Inspector of Election; the Election Schedule including the deadline of March 10, 2010, for submission of Candidates' Statements in order to have the names pre-printed on the ballots, a Candidates' Forum to be held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> Monday in May, and the Annual Members Meeting and Election of the Board of Directors on Monday, June 7, 2010, beginning at 4:00 p.m. In addition, the Board approved the cost of return postage for the 2010 Election secret ballots. (In the 2009 election, the return postage fees amounted to about \$400.00, in addition to the annual permit fee of \$185.00.)

**VOLUNTEER APPRECIATION EVENT**

The Board approved the Staff's recommendation of a budget not-to-exceed \$4,708.00 for the 2010 Volunteer Appreciation Dinner. This amount matches last year's actual cost for the event, which was \$292.00 under budget. The budget provides for the cost of a DJ throughout the evening, a catered dinner buffet, bar, invitations and decorations. The Volunteer Appreciation Dinner is scheduled for March 19, 2010.

**SINGINGWOODS TUNNEL GATE**

As recommended by Maintenance Manager Dana Baker, the Board approved the removal of gates and grates from the tunnel at Singingwoods Drive in The Woods. Mr. Baker was concerned that debris would build up during heavy storms, blocking drainage through the tunnel (part of the storm drain system) and causing water to overflow toward the homes along the creek.

**APPOINTMENT OF NEW DIRECTOR**

In light of Lisa Schoeneberger's resignation from the Board in January, the Board discussed filling the vacant Board seat. A motion to hold off on filling the vacancy did not receive a second, and another to address the issue at the March Board meeting to allow time for interested volunteers to come forward failed by a 2-to-4 vote. A third motion, to appoint Vicki Lloyd to fill the vacancy on the Board of Directors, was passed by a 4-to-2 vote. (See Vote Chart below for details.)

**Q. How often does the Association inspect the tracts for CC&R violations?**

**A.** Our CC&R Inspectors, Dale and Jack, inspect each tract weekly on various days of the week. Weather-permitting, they also walk their assigned tracts on a regular schedule, which is published in *The Mainsheet* each month in the "Greetings from Community Services" article. In the evenings, our Facility Services staff patrols in the tracts (except for sub-association neighborhoods) for vehicle parking violations.

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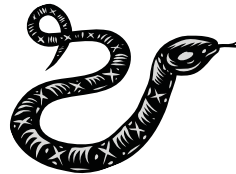
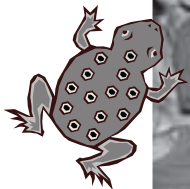
